Croeso/Welcome

Thank you for booking a stay at Nant Awen, I hope you are looking forward to your rural getaway.

Please take some time to read over the following information prior to your arrival so that we can hopefully ensure minimal contact with another human being for the entirety of your stay here!

Upon arriving on site please make use of the car park on the left to park your car before approaching the cottages over the bridge on foot.

Our dog Buffy may be out in the garden (you will hear her before you see her, she is a loudmouth when people arrive because she's a shameless attention seeker) although I will be keeping an ear out for your arrival in an effort to make sure she is in the house. If you have any reservations about meeting new dogs please do let me know before you arrive so I can make sure she is definitely inside when you get here.

The key to your cottage will be left in the door for you from 4pm onwards on the day of your arrival. Both cottages have the names engraved into the wooden lintel above the front doors (*not that I don't trust you to know where you're staying, but you can never be too sure*)

Hot tub 101

If your arrival day coincides with another guests departure then the hot tub will have been emptied and filled fresh. This does mean that it may not be to temperature (37 degrees) until later on that evening as they take about 8-12hours to heat up fully.

Please ensure you read and sign the hot tub safety document in the welcome folder when you arrive. In the meantime the beginners guide to getting in a hot tub is detailed here:

To open: unclip the lid and then lift it "in half" before using the **black rocker** and the **grey handle** to rock it backwards



The two buttons you want to focus on for use with the hot tub are the jets and the light.



The jets have two settings, one is like a half setting that honestly seems just to be about making ambient hot tub sounds and the other is the full bubbling experience, so press the jet button twice to get straight to the good stuff. The jets turn themselves off after about 20 minutes.

The light has a few different colour settings for you to bicker over which you prefer
hint: not yellow

The light won't turn off automatically, so if you could remember to turn it off when you step out that would be greatly appreciated.

You can adjust the force of each jet by turning the silver surrounds of each one

Please ensure the lid is closed and clipped when you get out.

The outside light in the garden is controlled by a switch indoors to the left of the french doors. (if you are staying in Y Capel, the light by the hot tub is controlled by a switch to the left of the front door... my electrician does what he likes and it doesn't always make sense)

Housekeeping

There is a complimentary basket of logs and kindling provided.

Any more logs I can provide at £5 a bag. Just drop me a call or a text and I will drop it off outside your door. Alternatively the village Spar also sells logs and kindling in case for some reason I can't be reached.

Spare batteries and lightbulbs are kept under the sink with the cleaning products, laundry bag and first aid kit.

On the day of your departure please strip the bed linen into the laundry bag provided, open the windows you can safely reach (bathroom and above the bed in Y Stabl/ the window seat in Y Capel) and leave the key on the table or in the lock of the front door.

Safety

If you begin to feel unwell during the stay we would ask that you return home immediately.

If you are too unwell to drive yourself home then we ask that you make arrangements for safe transport home.

We are a particularly rural location and our nearest A&E is Aberystwyth or Shrewsbury (both 1 hour travel)

Please be mindful of distance when out and about and near other guests, let's all keep each other safe whilst also enjoying the little safe haven we are lucky enough to have here at Nant Awen.
